Approx. 15 seals. Hundreds of cormorants. Mergansers. Gulls. And an eagle or two trying to snag whatever is available.

We've also seen a few "loners" traveling in Dana Passage. A few times they've appeared to be feeding rather aggressively near the surface. Watching the cormorants in our cove has shown there seems to be an abundance of bait fish.

2022-02-23 11:52	47.1896	-122.8120	Rhubart	20+	We're seeing an increasing number of harbor porpoise within our field of view. The winds calmed today and visibility is very good.
2022-03-18 00:00	47.1832	-122.8127	Rhubart	40+	Today, for the first time in several weeks, we're seeing HP, and there appears to be a fair number of them.
2022-04-24 09:07	47.3354	-122.4219	Roy	20+	I am at Redondo. I'm looking SW from Poverty bay and see 20-30 porpoises foraging in the waters between here and Commencement Bay. Probably somewhere off Dash Point. From my vantage they are pretty spread out west to east. --
2022-05-02 09:00	47.3360	-122.4119	Roy	20+	Pretty active today from where we can view at Redondo. I saw a bunch (20+) at noon, between Redondo and Maury. Now at 2pm, a bunch (20+) more south, we can see them as we're looking toward Ruston. I assume foraging (when they are popping up and back down). I still see a few now directly west of Redondo.
2022-05-15 11:17	47.3455	-122.3549	Roy	50+	Too many to guess. From Redondo looking west and then all the way south. They are everywhere. There's also orcas on the area, which is what I'm trying to see. I cannot not look and see the porpoises.

2023-01-20 13:20	47.1870	-122.8242	Rhubart		We're seeing considerably more HP today and they're spread over a very large area. Visibility is ideal with very flat calm water. It's been a long time since we have seen so many. (later that day) I don't think we saw as many as a few years ago, but it was encouraging to see the numbers increasing and also how much larger the area was than previously. I hope conditions improve so you can get out there. In this weather I am grateful we can observe from the comfort of home with big binoculars!
2023-04-10 14:54	47.3511	-122.3430	Roy	20+	I'm in Redondo and seeing tons of porpoises. A group of 15-20 closer to Redondo, another group more mid way between Maury and Redondo, and still some beyond that. I see them come up, the dorsal fin and they go back down.
2023-04-25 11:18	47.1473	-122.9135	Merriman	40+	So I missed video, but there were at least 10 just now feeding near the surface. Halfway between me and B Harbor. Near where we first saw them this morning. First one fin. Then two. Then three in a shallow surface. Then the entire aggregation close together and at the surface before they dove and moved on. Others in twos and threes heading south (traveling) into Eld closer to the far (eastern) shore at Cooper Point. (lasted through 2023-03026)
